**AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE**

On January 21, 2010 I Detective Michael Schultz and Detective Rich Iannuzzo responded to 632 Moosic Street for a report of a female that was lit on fire. Detective Lt. Lafferty advised that there was a female at 632 Moosic Street that was on fire and transported to the CMC Hospital by ambulance for treatment. Lt. Lafferty said the female victim was being transported to Lehigh Burn Center from CMC and was unavailble to speak with. Lt. Lafferty said the female was making allegations that a male named "Randy" lit the her on fire. Detectives Schultz and Iannuzzo responded to 632 Moosic Street, apartment 2 and met with Patrol Officers who had a crime scene established. The victim was identified as Marianne Krug.

Detectives found four males sitting outside of apartment 2. The four males were identified as Randy Barr, Stephen Frack, Terence Healey, and Michael Ottey. The renter of the apartment was Terance Healey. Randy Barr and Michael Ottey also lives at the apartment. Stephen Frack was just a visitor. All four males were in the apartment when Patrol arrived with the ambulance to find the victim burned. All four males voluntarily came into Police HQ to speak with Detectives about the victim.

Detectives Schultz and Iannuzzo interviewed Stephen Frack first. Detectives asked Frack what happened inside the apartment with the victim being on fire and burned. Frack said "that girl did not deserve that". Detectives asked Frack what he meant by that statement and what took place inside the apartment. Frack said Randy Barr was argueing with the victim Marianne all night. Frack said it was him, Randy, Marianne, and Terance all in the living room watching television. Frack said Randy left the living room and went out into the kitchen area. Frack said Randy came back into the living room and doused Marianne with charcoal lighter fluid.

**AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE CONTINUATION**

Frack said Marianne was sitting on the couch next to Terance when Randy doused her with lighter fluid. Frack said Randy lit the victim on fire after he doused her with the lighter fluid. Frack said the victim was on fire for a small amount of time, and Randy himself put the fire out by tapping with his hands on the victim. Frack said the lighter fluid was in a white container. Frack said Terance took the lighter fluid and hid it in his bedroom so Randy could not get it. Frack said Randy started making threats saying he would "burn the bitch up", and he would "burn the house down". Frack said some time went by and he, Terance, and Marianne went into the bedroom to discuss getting Randy out of the apartment. Frack said Randy left the apartment and went to get cigarette butts out of the ashtray at Sunoco on Moosic Street.


Frack said he went back into the living room and was watching a DVD. Frack said Marianne came out of the bedroom and walked into the living room. Frack said Marianne asked him for a lighter and then went into the bathroom. Frack said Marianne went into the bathroom and started screaming for help, that she was on fire, and it hurts. Frack said he started screaming for Terance to help. Frack said him and Terance took wet towels and treated the victim Marianne. Frack said the ambulance and Police showed up and transported the victim to the hospital.

Detective Schultz interviewed the victims boyfriend Terance Healey. Healey said his girlfriend and Randy were argueing all night. Healey said Randy was staying there for the time being. Healey said his girlfriend was upset with him because she wanted to know why he let Randy pour charcoal lighter fluid on her and didn't do anything to Randy. Terance said he saw the fluid on his girlfriend and could smell some odor from the charcoal lighter fluid. Terance said he heard his girlfriend and Stephen screaming for help and when he went out to the bathroom his girlfriend was severly burned already.

Detectives Schultz and Iannuzzo interviewed Randy Barr at Police HQ. Barr initially said he was sleeping during the entire incident. Barr then said he was gone out of the apartment to get cigarette butts and when he came back the victim was burned. Detectives questioned Barr if he doused the victim with charcoal lighter fluid. Barr denied dousing the victim with charcoal lighter fluid. Barr changed his story again and said he did douse the victim with charcoal lighter fluid.

Barr said he went through the kitchen onto the back porch. Barr said he grabbed the charcoal lighter fluid off the back porch and walked into the living room. Barr said he doused the victim with the lighter fluid while she was sitting on the couch. Barr said he took matches out of his pocket, lit a match, and flicked it at the victim. Barr said the victim caught on fire for a brief moment. Barr said he took his own hands and put the fire out on the victim.

Detectives asked Barr why he would douse the victim with charcoal lighter fluid and light her on fire. Barr said he was angry with the victim because she was talking down to him all night. Barr said the victim threatened to poison his dog, which also made him angry. Barr said he wanted to prove a point that he was serious and lit her on fire. Barr turned over a pack of cardboard matches he said he flicked at the victim when he lit her on fire. Detectice Castellano later recovered two used matches from the couch area. Barr said he really did leave some time after he initially lit the victim on fire to get cigarette butts. Barr said when he came back the victim was burned in the bathroom and Terance and Steve were helping her. During a search of the apartment Police found charcoal lighter fluid in a white container in Terance Healey's bedroom.

**AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE CONTINUATION**

The victim was life flighted from CMC to the Lehigh Valley burn center. Detectives spoke with hospital staff at Lehigh who said the victim is in critical condition as a result of the injuries from the fire. Randy Barr will be charged with 3301 (a) Arson and related offenses, 2702 (a)(1) Aggravated Assault, 2702 (a) (4) Aggravated Assault, 2701 (a) (1) Simple Assault, 2705 Recklessly Endangering another person, and 2706 Terroristic Threats.
